1 Welcoming Address from Carolin Göhler, President

Carolin Göhler (CG), Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and confirmed the meeting was quorate, introduced the Trustees in attendance and confirmed that:

- All members eligible to vote had the opportunity to do so in advance and that online voting for those in attendance at the meeting would remain open until the conclusion of the main business of the AGM;

2 Presentation from Mat Haslam, Honorary Treasurer

The meeting noted a presentation from Mat Haslam (MH) Honorary Treasurer, on the financial position of the Institute and the future picture.

MH opened by formally recording thanks to the CEO and staff team, Finance & Risk Committee, and the Board of Trustees for ensuring finance runs through all that we do in and their essential support in maintaining financial rigour.

8 Update from Jonathan Ellis, Director of Membership & Professional Standards

The meeting noted a presentation from Belinda Gordon (BG) the new Director of Policy & Public Affairs.

- The aim is to increase the Institute's visibility and influence and foster impactful partnerships, working collectively with members to tackle societal needs and environmental challenges.
- A phased plan for enhancing LI's external influence, prioritising decision-maker engagement and advocacy.
- Plans to develop a comprehensive action programme which prioritises impactful areas and delivery.
- Continue to implement the New Ways of Working programme
- Develop clear corporate and business strategies to align limited resources with priorities.
- Strengthen engagement and collaborative working with stakeholders and branches/members and put their views and needs at the heart of the new Public Policy and Public Affairs and Technical Standards standing committees.

10 Update: Carolin Göhler, President

The meeting noted an update from the President who reported on:

- How the LI New Ways of Working programme is building the foundations and frameworks needed to deliver on the Institutes objectives.

- We can lead key conversations by promoting a landscape-led approach to benefit people, place and nature - emphasising that none of this is possible without our continued work to build collaborative partnerships across the built environment and beyond.
- Working closely with LI practices and wider membership has continued to be at the forefront.
- The update reflected on innumerable meetings with members and visiting countless practices and seeing the positive contribution and value added by their work and taking on board feedback on how the LI can better support them and that.
- The LI is taking an increasingly proactive strategic approach to influence by strengthening its relationships with key organisations and building new partnerships.

- Launching our new Corporate Strategy in 2025, which will lead us to the LI's Centenary Year in 2029
- Working with all levels of membership to help drive our agenda on key issues
- Attracting the next generation into the profession, building our student network and expanding the routes into the profession
- Working collaboratively to address EDI.
